

ABCs of Animals

The ABCs of animals will be quick individual units on one animal from each letter of the alphabet on 2 worksheets each. It is recommended that class units be done twice a week for 13 weeks. Supplies will be minimal and things you should already have on hand. Kids will learn more about the animals around them while learning core Pagan wisdom.

What is included in the units?

1. Scientific information and fun information for each animal.
2. Kids will color the continents where the animal resides in the wild (for the most part).
3. They will be able to add correspondences and dream information to their own journal and diaries.
4. There will be a writing exercise for each animal.
5. There is also a basic Pagan activity to help aid them in the journey.

As with all things Pagan please read assignments in advance to make sure your beliefs follow the line of thought presented. Feel free to add, take out, or change anything to make lessons fit your family better.
