Ostara Lapbook Information & Directions

Symbols of Ostara

It is important that your child become familiar with the symbols of Ostara. Younger kids can simply know what they are, older kids can learn the significance of them to the holiday. Below is a list of the symbols that are provided by image so you can help them write the name of the image below it. Extra room is provided for the older kids to add more information if they want to. There are two extra blank tiles provided in case you have a symbol that is important to you and not provided in the clipart fashion.

Gods & Goddesses

This is a great time to get your child/ren more in tune with the Gods and Goddesses of Ostara. Have your child/ren use a card to list either the God or Goddess, a little about them, and even draw what they feel that deity looks like on the back side. Use their homemade cards as flashcards until they memorize what you would like them to know.

My Ostara Projects

Allow your child/ren to do Ostara projects of their own to add into the holiday festivities. Do projects that they normally do and/or choose some from the list below. In the lapbook allow them to write the name of each project on the tab. Kids can write what they did, add photo's, or whatever feels right under each tab. Be sure to only include as many tabs as you plan on doing projects for Ostara.

Color Eggs

Use natural egg color, you can use the lapbook for ideas as well as teach colors and the meanings of them on eggs. Remove food substance before coloring eggs. Be sure to leave the eggs in the color longer than the usual vinegar based colors. Use a white crayon to draw Pagan designs on the eggs before coloring. If you or your child does not want to go through all the trouble of traditional colors simply etch brown eggs by writing or drawing Pagan symbols on it using vinegar.

Make an egg shell tree

Clean egg shells (in halves) and poke holes in each side and thread with pipe cleaners to resemble baskets. Paint the shells or leave them white, or brown, and hang them on a fallen branch found

outside. The branch can be blessed or at least thanking the nature spirits for it. The tree can be placed

on the home or personal altar.

Do a dance

Do an outside dance like the wind dance allowing you to come one with the wind. Wear loose fitting, flowing clothes that will allow them to move with the wind. Move as the wind does with arms stretched out. For a group you could do the Spiral dance to represent the circle of life. Get in a circle and join hands or bind them loosely with a scarf. Have the first one in your line move to the center pulling all others to the center then move to the outside.

Planted a fearie garden

Use Fairy friendly flowers from seeds or cuttlings. Be sure to let your child/ren know that this is a great time to plant them. Bless seeds or cuttlings before planting them. Leave an offering to the spirits or faeries of milk, homey, bread, or berries.

Spring Cleaning

Start with a meditation or blessing. End with a blessing to close off the project. You could also offer something to the nature spirits as a extra touch.

Plant an herb garden

Plant an herb garden for medicinal or magickal purposes. Make plans as far as layout (make a circle of life or other Pagan symbol). Bless seeds or allow them to be present in the Ostara ritual for energy.

Set-Up an Ostara Altar

Use eggs, nature scraps found on the ground, spring flowers, or any other typically Ostara object to set-up a personal or family Ostara altar. Allow your child to help with preparation and execution of it.

Signs of Spring

Ostara is the beginning of spring and an excellent opportunity for your first signs of Spring walk. Have your child/ren look for the signs of spring using what you know and the small list below. When done have them tell about all the signs of Spring that they saw one per circle in their lapbook.

Lamb

Robin Seeds

Flowers

Sun

My Ostara Spell

Use this opportunity for your child/ren to get familiar with spells. A beginning of the spell has been written for them, they just need to finish it with what they want out of the spell (be sure to tell them all about what should and shouldn't be directed to in a spell if they don't already know. Have them write it in the book then use it in

this simple Ostara spell:

After writing it exactly how it is wanted to be worded in the lapbook, rewrite it on a piece of light colored cloth.

Go to the woods or somewhere where spring is abundant and read it to the land spirits.

> Add some spring herb or flower petals to it and fold it up as small as they can. Dig a hole as deep as they want to being careful not to bother any other growing Plant then cover it up.

As spring gets into bloom around it the wish or action they wrote about in the spell will come to be.

Egg Colors

Have you child/ren write the color that cooresponds with how to make a natural dye and it's correspondences on the outside flap. If they don't know them or need some extra help the answers are below. For the holiday allow them to color eggs using some of these natural dyes as one of the Ostara project.

Yellow – carrot tops – creativity, knowledge
Orange – onion skin – sun, energy
Blue – blueberries – protection, healing
Red – cherries – sacred, strength
Green – spinach – growth, prosperity
Pink – beets – love, peace

Pagan Orgins






Lapbook templates below. Lapbook will be only 1 folder!


Cut out the square. Fold on middle Line. Glue side labeled 'glue' to the Lap book.


















Cut out on dark lines the title page and as many tabbed images as needed for this project. Staple together on staple lines Provided. Glue last tabbed image to lap















Cut out as many circles as needed for your Spring walk. Stack circles together and poke a hole in the top where sample is shown. Use a brad to affix to lap book.













Cut out on dark lines as many symbol images needed for the lap book. Stack them with labeled images on top and staple on line then glue to lap book.











Cut out spell bag on thick lines then fold. Cut out square on bold lines then glue to Inside of the cover of the spell bag. Glue Back side (labeled glue) to the lap book.
